The Old Takoma Business Association (OTBA) has developed three investment platforms that will allow residents to support their local business community and earn interest on their investments:

Platform One is being offered in conjunction with the Washington Area Community Investment Fund (WACIF). Investors can buy WACIF Neighborhood Notes, designate Takoma Park as their neighborhood, and see their money go to businesses in the Takoma Park area.

Platform Two includes Takoma Notes that investors will be able to purchase directly from the OTBA in order to support specific businesses in Old Takoma.

Platform Three is a crowdfunding option, where Maryland residents can lend directly up to \$100 per Maryland business and earn interest on their investments.
